Man charged with highway killing

ANNAPOLIS (AP) — A Bowie man has been charged with first-degree murder for allegedly running over a dismounted motorcyclist in Crofton on Friday.

Robert Leland Stewart, 23, was held Saturday in Anne Arundel County Detention Center without bail, said county police spokesman Dick Molloy.

Mr. Stewart was allegedly behind the wheel of a car when he and the cyclist, Anthony Louis Clanton, 26, of Lanham became embroiled in an argument after a near collision.

According to authorities, Mr. Clanton was nearly struck by Mr. Stewart on Route 3 near Route 450 in Crofton.

Arrests in Cyclist's Death

■ Two men were arrested yesterday in the death of a motorcyclist run down and killed Friday by a motorist after an argument on Route 3 near Crofton, Anne Arundel County police said.

Charged with first-degree murder was Robert Leland Stewart, 23, of Bowie, driver of the car in the incident, police said. John Wallis Heimer, 25, of Essex, who police said was a passenger in the car, was charged with being accessory in the death.

Stewart is being held in the

Anne Arundel County Detention Center without bond. Heimer is being held under \$5,000 bond.

Police said the motorcyclist, Anthony Louis Clanton, 27, of Lanham, was run over by the driver of a car whom he had cursed for nearly striking him on his motorcycle. After an exchange of words, Clanton got off his cycle, and the motorist pursued him, striking him on the side of the road, police said. He was pronounced dead at Prince George's Hospital.





SENATOR CHAFEE'S S 1007 FINDS A COMPANION IN THE HOUSE

On Friday, February 2, 1990, Congressman Jim Cooper (D-TN), introduced a House version of Senator Chafee's blackmail/bribery Bill, S 1007.

The new Bill, HR 3925, basically says that up to 95 million dollars in grants will be available to the states which adopt seatbelt (automobiles) and helmet (motorcycles) laws within three (3) years.

At the beginning of the 4th year, sanctions would then apply. States who have not adopted these mandatory laws will lose 5% of highway funds the first year and 10% each year there after.

This Bill has joint jurisdiction - two committees: 1) Energy and Commerce, and 2) Public Works and Transportation. Therefore, HR 3925 must pass through both committees before it goes to the Floor for a vote.

As of this date, there has been no further movement on S 1007. However, at NCOM's recent Board of Advisors Meeting, the Legislative Task Force urged rights groups to be diligent and continue writing the Senators on the Environment and Public Works committee.

Updates on both S 1007 and HR 3925 will follow.
