The Maryland general election is on November 8, 2022, we will be hustling to see what changes might be taking place. We will have a new Governor and a few new faces in the House and Senate. We will need to make sure we get to know them all and determined what the new committee assignment's will be for the year. Maryland legislative session will start in January 2023 and we want to hit the ground running. Those 90 days go by really quick and we need to be prepared to act. Our plans for the 2023 legislative year are as follows:

- Helmet Bill: ABATE has always advocated for FREEDOM of CHOICE. We want to give adult riders the choice regarding wearing a helmet. The American Motorcyclist Association and the Motorcycle Riders Foundation agree that mandatory helmet laws do nothing to prevent crashes and both support voluntary helmet usage. It is vital have the knowledge and experience to possibly avoid a crash altogether. Our position has always been that there is no replacement for education, experience, and training when it comes to motorcycle safety. Currently, 32 states have either no helmet law or only require it for certain ages (under 21, age varies by state).
- Must Appear: We will continue to fight to require a court appearance for those that cause an accident that results in serious injury or death of another. There should be no option for paying a fine and avoiding court if you have taken a life. 14 years ago, we were able to pass a law establishing that if a person fails to yield the right-of-way in violation of specified provisions of law and the violation contributes to an accident that results in the death or serious bodily injury of another, the person is subject to a specified fine and the Motor Vehicle Administration is authorized to suspend the person's license for a specified period of time; etc. However, we have since learned that without the mandatory court appearance, many times a serious violation is either never issued or the person that caused death of another is able to pay a fine and never have to appear in court and face the families and friends of the injured / deceased.
- Grass Clippings: To quote the famous comedian Ron White, "it's not THAT the wind is blowin", it's WHAT the wind is blowin". When grass gets cut along the side of a road, many times it contains more than just grass. There could be sand, gravel, stones, broken glass, shredded metal, etc. When that area gets mowed and blown onto the roadway surface, there could be problems. When you add rain or a heavy dew the next morning, you now have dangerous hidden debris and that grass can become as slippery as ice. Several counties in Maryland already have some version of this law on the books, as well as many other states. It is time for Maryland to address this issue.

We will also be tracking any legislation that comes up that could affect motorcyclists'. That is one of our biggest challenges. Sometimes a bill gets presented that is not motorcycle friendly and we must be prepared to challenge these as well.

Please try and make a few Monday Night Lobbying events in Annapolis or maybe attend a committee hearing if possible. We understand that not everyone can make it out all of the time, but the more people they see, the bigger our voice becomes. Remember **YOU are ABATE!** Get out there and **BE ABATE!**

Meeting of the Minds 2022

MRF Freedom Fighters 2022 By: Linda Wainer, ABATE of Maryland, Inc. Recording Secretary

Legislative strategy, defending motorcyclist rights in a world that wants us off the road,

leadership, and most of all the gathering of 400 of the most dedicated, passionate freedom fighters on the planet, that is what the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) Meeting of the Minds annual conference is.

The reality is that all electric vehicles are here, and they are not going away. As motorcyclists we must define a strategy for including them in our world.





AMA News

PICKERINGTON, Ohio (July 20, 2022) — The votes have been tallied, and the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame is proud to announce the six inductees to be honored during the 2022 AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony on Oct. 28 in Pickerington, Ohio.





The induction ceremony will include a cocktail reception at the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame followed by dinner and the induction ceremony at the nearby Violet Township Event Center on Friday evening, with the following day to include an Open House and Class of 2022 installation exhibit in the AMA Hall of Fame Museum on the AMA campus.

Hall of Fame inductees are selected from eight areas of influence: Ambassadors/Industry, Design/ Engineering, Dirt Track, Leadership/Motorcycle Rights, Motocross/Supercross, Off-Road, Road Racing and Specialty Competition.

KENNY COOLBETH

Kenny Coolbeth began his national flat track racing career in 1994, winning the AMA Rookie of the Year award, and went on to win three AMA Grand National Championships in 2006, 2007 and 2008 while part of the factory Harley-Davidson team. Throughout his quarter-century career he compiled 27 AMA Grand National wins — sixth on the all-time list — and 108 AMA Grand National podiums.

GREG HANCOCK

Racer Greg Hancock has earned four Speedway World championships and eight AMA U.S. National Speedway championships in a career spanning four decades, with 2019 marking his 27th and last season competing in the Speedway World Championship series. While logging a record 218 Speedway Grand Prix appearances, he has finished in the top five in World Speedway competition 17 times, and finished in the top three eight times.

EFFIE HOTCHKISS

The first woman to complete a transcontinental motorcycle ride, Effie Hotchkiss began riding aboard small used motorcycles such as a single-cylinder Harley-Davidson. She purchased a brand-new 1915 Harley-Davidson 3-speed twin and left her job to travel by motorcycle to California. Effie's mother, who worried about her daughter's safety, joined her in a sidecar. Their journey began on May 2, 1915, and once they reached California, the two turned around and headed home in late August, finally completing the dream adventure in October.

SANDY KOSMAN

The late Sandy Kosman was a true pioneer in aftermarket chassis design and fabrication, an early producer of motorcycle-specific drag racing, flat track and road racing parts and products from the mid 1960s to the 2000s. Kosman found solutions to the increased demands upon competition motorcycles as horse-power increased over the years by creating chassis, brake and wheel systems that excelled in the most demanding racing applications. His chassis and parts designs in the drag racing world are perhaps his best -known contributions to motorcycle competition.

BEN SPIES

Ben Spies is considered one of the greatest American road racers in the history of the sport. Nicknamed "Elbowz" due to his signature riding style that showcased his always-protruding elbows, Spies' five AMA National Championships include the 2008, 2007 and 2006 AMA Superbike titles, the 2007 AMA Superstock title, and the 2003 AMA Formula Xtreme title. He also competed successfully in World Superbike and MotoGP competition, scoring the 2009 World Superbike championship.

JAMES STEWART

James "Bubba" Stewart was a dominant force in AMA Pro Motocross and AMA Supercross, winning two AMA Supercross national championships, three AMA Pro Motocross titles, two Motocross des Nations championships and seven AMA Amateur National Motocross Championships at Loretta Lynn's. In 2008, Stewart won every race and every moto in the AMA Pro Motocross season, only the second motocross racer to ever notch a perfect season.
