### From The Assistant Director

Flat Track Racing Is Back At The Cumberland Raceway! After the ABATE of Maryland Cumberland Party in June of 1992, I was chatting with the stock car promoter at the Allegany Fairgrounds in Cumberland, Maryland. He asked, "Why doesn't ABATE sponsor a motorcycle race since there is a half mile dirt track at the Fairgrounds?" I replied, "Because ABATE does not DO motorcycles races!!" Then I asked myself why not? So shortly thereafter I got in touch with the AMA and told them I wanted to promote a Flat Track Race in Cumberland. But they didn't seem to take me seriously. By the following February I had just about given up on the idea. Then I spoke to Norm Farris from Cycle World in Baltimore (and the father of AMA Pro Rodney Farris). Norm stoked a fire under my seat. We happened to be talking at the International Bike Show in Baltimore so there were all the RIGHT people in one place. So I talked to the AMA people and they referred me to the local District 7 of the AMA. With the help of Richard Ford of District 7 AMA, I got sanctioned and the first ABATE of Maryland Flat Track Race was on for June of 1993. In March of 1993 I happened to be at Pooles Harley Davidson in Canada. I told the owner that I was from Maryland and he asked

me if I had ever been to the flat track race in Cumberland. He went on to say that the track in Cumberland was the best track in all of North America. And so it is.

That year ABATE of Maryland sponsored its first ever dirt flat track race. The back drop of the race track is a mountain just across the Potomac River in West Virginia. It is a spectacularly beautiful location that, together with the sounds of the bikes reverberating off the mountains, is almost a religious experience.

This year's race, June 11, is not only on the AMA Pro-AM Dirt Track schedule, but also features an America Historic Racing Association (AHRMA) National dirt flat track race. The AHRMA races will be a "two-fer" for the racers, since they will also be racing the day before in Budds Creek. The Vintage bikes will add six additional races to the program. There will be a pre-1952 "Dinosaur" tank shifter class without brakes (yes, no brakes); pre-1974 two stroke and four stroke classes (also without brakes); and the relatively "modern" pre-1974 classes, 250, 600, and 750cc bikes. The AHRMA races are highlighted by a \$1,000 hand-shifter "mini-series" cash purse put together for the two Maryland races and one to be held in

Weedsport, New York. It will be called the East Coast Hand Shift Challenge Series, and is being supported by ABATE of Maryland, Ken McGuire of Weedsport, Boston's Motorcycle Cafe, and maybe more. It is rumored that legendary flattracker George Roeder may even show up!

With the addition of these historic motorcycles, the race will come full circle because there used to be motorcycle racing at this very track more than 25 years ago. As a matter of fact, there used to be a Grand National Dirt Track race at this track. Some of the AHRMA racers that will be racing this year used to race in Cumberland many years ago. So I'm looking forward to this year's race with a lot of enthusiasm. I hope that some of the older racers can fill me in on more of the history of this great old race track.

To get to the races (or to the ABATE of Maryland Cumberland Party, which will be held June 9-11, also at the Allegany Fairgrounds) take I-70 West to I-68 West to Route 220 South. The Fairgrounds will be about 5 miles on your left. For more information, call ABATE of Maryland at 800-843-0252 or out of state 410-263-9185.

### From The Legislative Representative

HB 1175 - a bill that will allow special tags was amended before it left committee. Thanks to Mike Miles, John Murray, and Chris Semler for speaking with members on the committee and getting them to amend the bill to include handicapped tags for motorcycles! That bill was passed. That is our legislative win for the session. Handicapped tags for motorcycles will be available through the MVA by October 1.

There has been discussions about filing our bills in both houses. There is a down side to that - we have limited resources - people to lobby. We need to work to get each bill out of its committee, then out of its chamber, and let it progress that way. If we any one bill on both sides - we will have to

work twice as hard and the odds of the bill being killed are doubled.

The bills that we are working on for next session are: the helmet law repeal for adults, antidiscrimation in public establishments, parking more than one motorcycle in a metered spot, and secured funding for the Motorcycle Safety Program.

Strategy for next session - get in touch with your legislators back in your home district now. Many will be having fund-raisers in the upcoming months, go to them. We still need to develop and maintain our relationships with the legislators year-round. It is the only way that we will get our other bills passed. If you live in Anne Arundel or Baltimore City, you need to get in touch with Senators Jimeno and

Middlebrooks or Senators Kelly and Hughes, respectively. If you live in Montgomery County, you need to contact Senator Forehand. These are the Senators on the Judicial Proceedings Committee that did not vote for the helmet law repeal. We need to convince them to change their vote next year.

We have made tremendous gains in the past session. We have alot of new friends and many old friends in the legislature, let's keep up the good work! We will get our bills passed if we are persistent, but not pushy; patient, but not complacent, and we will persevere in our efforts.



### From The Assistant Legislative Director

Just because something is right, or a good idea, does not mean that the General Assembly will pass it into law. The discrimination bill (SB 191) we proposed last session passed the Senate 46-0 and then stopped dead in the House Commerce and Government Matters Committee. The chairman of the committee (Delegate Curran) apparently decided to let the session run out without even voting on this bill. His decision therefore ends the bill's chances until next year when we must start all over again.

If you're as disgusted with how this all worked out as I am, write to Delegate Curran and politely voice your opinion. His mailing address is at the end of this letter.

We've already started to work on the discrimination for next year as well as other bills. Delegates have already contacted us about sponsoring next year's bill in the House as well as the Senate.

The bill may also be rewritten in a slightly different form giving it a better chance of passing next session. We intend to use what we've learned over the last two years to create a slightly different bill and hopefully get it into a more friendly committee. We will not, however, change the intent of this bill which is to stop discrimination toward all motorcyclists in Maryland's public accommodations.

The restaurant and retail merchant lobbies carry a lot of weight in

Annapolis. This is our main opposition; they have a lot more time and money to lobby against this bill than we have to lobby for it. This is the reason that everyone must get involved to get this bill, as well as others, passed. Visit your legislators over the summer, as well as when the session starts. Start writing your letters now telling them how you feel about certain issues. Voice your opinions because your opposition is voicing theirs.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY PROGRAM BEGINS ELEVENTH SEASON

Program continues to educate riders on dangers of the road

Glen Burnie, MD (May 19, 1995) - With the arrival of spring and the nice weather that goes with it, more and more motorcycle enthusiasts will be hitting the streets and riding the highways. The Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) of the Maryland Department of Transportation is doing its part to help keep all motorists safe by continuing to offer the Motorcycle Safety Program (MCSP).

Now in its eleventh year of offering educational courses to both new and experienced riders, the MCSP is operating 12 centers at various sites throughout the state of Maryland. The award winning program has trained over 25,000 students since 1985, and more than half of those students have gone on to get their class M license.

"It's been an extremely successful program, one which is important to all Marylanders who share our highways," commented MVA Administrator W. Marshall Rickert. "Both automobiles and motorcycles need to look out for one another and the Motorcycle Safety Program elevates the importance of this kind of safety education."

There are two courses currently offered, both costing \$50 per student. The beginners course teaches the fundamentals of riding and helps the student overcome any initial fears of actually operating a motorcycle. The program consists of eight hours in the classroom and 12 hours on the motorcycle itself. After successfully completing the course, students may test for their Class M motorcycle license. Students must possess their motorcycle learner's permit

In addition, a second course is offered for the more experienced rider. This program refines a cyclists abilities and reinforces the skills they have already developed. Both courses are completed within three to four days.

According to Andy Krajewski, MSCP Coordinator, while most of the students are males, women now make up approximately one third of the total enrollment. "They want to learn to ride just as much as the men do," Krajewski said.

The MCSP is currently offered at Allegany, Carroll, Harford and Prince George's Community Colleges, as well as the Glen Burnie, Annapolis, Hagerstown, Frederick, Salisbury and Waldorf MVA offices. There are also training centers at Seton Keough High School in Baltimore City and the Orbital Space Center (formally Fairchild Space Industries) in Germantown.

The program provides motorcycles and safety equipment for the students to train with during the course. Students are asked to wear protective clothing, including long pants and long sleeves, as well as ankle leather shoes or boots during the actual motorcycle training.



### A MOTORCYCLIST GOES DOWN -- DO YOU KNOW WHAT TO DO?

There's been a motorcycle accident! What can YOU do?

You can help make the most of the "Golden Hour," the precious time between the accident and the emergency room.

Remain calm and think. Remember your ABC's:

Airway:

Make sure the patient has an open airway.

Breathing:

Look, listen and feel to see if the injured biker is breathing. If not, give 2 slow full breaths

into his or her mouth.

Circulation:

Check for pulse in neck. If no pulse, start CPR.

Assess the situation for safety factors. What is the traffic situation? Is the accident site secure? Is there a hazardous material spill, or gas leaking from the bike? Are power lines down? Is there a fire danger?

Form a safety line around the downed rider. Introduce yourself. Delegate someone to call an ambulance, preferably a woman (in case they need to go knocking on doors for help). Make sure they have as many facts as possible, including the exact location of the accident, how many people are injured and how seriously. The person calling the ambulance should hang up last.

Do not move the patient. Do not remove the helmet. Improperly removing the helmet can cause spinal chord injury, paralysis or even death (you can get a free helmet sticker that says: "WARNING - Do Not Remove Helmet Until I Am Examined By A Doctor" by calling Aid to Injured Motorcyclists (A.I.M.) at 800/ON-A-BIKE). If necessary, it is possible to give CPR without removing the helmet, even if it is a full face helmet (A.I.M. also has a free "Survival Card" that instructs how to properly remove a helmet from an accident victim if it is absolutely necessary).

Turn off the key to the motorcycle and shut off the gas.

Keep the patient talking. Ask questions; who are you, where are you, what day is it? Have someone write down all the details; vital signs, pulse, breathing. When the ambulance arrives, give them the notes and an honest evaluation of the patient's condition, including drug or alcohol consumption. Ask emergency personnel what you can do for them.

Talk with police when they arrive. Make their job easier by cooperating. Even after police and emergency personel have secured the site, you can continue to help the downed motorcyclist by photographing the accident scene, jotting down notes about the accident while they're still fresh in your mind, and make sure police get the names and addresses of all witnesses for the police report.

We have to take care of each other out there. Take a CPR course or, even better, a First-Aid class. Be prepared to take charge if someone goes down. It's better to know what to do and never have to use it than to waste your fellow rider's Golden Hour because you think that accidents only happen to other people.



### THE BILL OF RIGHTS

### Article I

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or of the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

### Article II

A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.

### Alugie III

No Soldier shall, in time of peace be appartered in only house, without the consent of the Owner, nor in time of war, but in a manyer to be prescribed by law.

The right of the people to be secure in their persons, to the papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrolly shall issue but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing in place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.

No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or object lise infamous crime, unless in a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the Militia, when in actual service in time of War or public danger; has shall any person be subject for me same offence to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without the process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use without just compensation.

### Article VI

In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the State and district wherein the crime shall have been committed, which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be confronted with the witnesses against him; to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have the assistance of Counsel for his defence.

### Article VII

In suits at common law, where the value in controversy shall exceed twenty dollars, the right of trial by jury shall be preserved, and no fact tried by a jury shall be otherwise re-examined in any Court of the United states, than according to the rules of the common law.

### Article VIII

Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishments inflicted.

### Article IX

The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people.

### Article X

The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.
